Half Marathon Run Club or Run for Fitness & Fun Club



D.W.E. would like to invite any **grade 4**, **5**, **and 6 students** who are interested in being fit and healthy to come out and run in either the Half Marathon Run Club or the Run for Fitness & Fun Club.

Half Marathon Run Club: This is for students who would like to reach the goal of completing an accumulated total of 21 km over the course of our spring season (by running 3 km each Run Club Day). Students do not need to be an athlete but do need to be able to run 3 km and have perseverance and willpower to work towards their goal.

Run for Fitness & Fun Club: This is for students who do not wish to reach the 21 km goal and who only need to be able to run 2 km. They just want to come out for the fun, fitness, and social aspects of running. They still need to be committed to come out and run at all sessions.

When? We will be running Tuesdays and Thursdays at lunch (play time). We will begin with a short stretch, then start our run. Upon the completion of their run, students will record their kilometers, then stay outside to play for the remaining lunch hour. Run Club will last for approximately 4 weeks.
